The theme for this year's conference was "Enhancing Value-based Care: Generating New Knowledge." This is an amazing opportunity for the recipient to meet nurse researchers and hear about the research work being carried out in the region. • Endowment Scholarship:

The Center for Hispanic Studies in Nursing and Health awarded a \$1,000 scholarship for the spring semester to an undergraduate student in the AP-BSN program at UT Arlington, College of Nursing. We are able to fund this scholarship through the Center's Endowment Fund. Eligibility criteria include full-time enrollment in the College of Nursing and an expressed intention in pursuing a nursing role with the Hispanic population. The recipient of the Center's scholarship will be invited to attend the annual Dream Makers Scholarship Luncheon hosted by the College of Nursing on March 3rd.

The application has been finalized for an award to support an active member of the Hispanic Student Nursing Association (HSNA) to attend the 39th Annual Conference of the National Association of Hispanic Nurses (NAHN). This year's conference "Honor the Past, Treasure the Present, Shape the Future" will be held July 15-18, in Miami, FL. The student representative selected from the College of Nursing will be able to meet other nursing students and nurses from around the nation, as well as hear from speakers presenting at the conference.
